Our history

The presence of a Jewish community in Florence dates back to the 15th century under Cosimo il Vecchio de' Medici. In 1570 Jews were forced to live in a Ghetto with restrictions on their freedom. In 1848 the Ghetto was opened, but it was not until the Unification of Italy in 1861 that Jews were finally allowed to occupy important political, cultural and artistic positions in Florentine society. In 1938 the Fascist government enacted Racial Laws with strict bans marginalizing Jews from civil life. On November 9th, 1943, the first convoy of deportees for Auschwitz departed from platform 16 of the Santa Maria Novella railway station in Florence. Between 1943 and 1944, more than 500 Jews were deported from Florence. After the Shoah, the Jewish Community re-flourished around the

Great Synagogue, which became a symbol of rebirth.

Who we are today

The Jewish Community of Florence has just under 1000 members, mainly of Sephardic origin, but also includes Ashkenazi Jews from Eastern Europe, Israel and the United States. The congregation is Italian Orthodox.

What we do

The Jewish Community offers an important connection for all Jews to feel at home in Florence with a complete range of social and educational services including a Jewish Preschool, Talmud Torah, Youth Groups, a Jewish Women's Group, a Library, Historical Archives, Beth Midrash and adult study groups, as well as religious services such as Brit Milot, B'nei Mitzvah, Weddings, Mikveh and Jewish Cemeteries.

The Jewish Community also organizes cultural events open to the public and promotes kosher food for visitors. The synagogue in Siena is also part of the Jewish Community of Florence.

To support and enhance Jewish life, learning and heritage in Florence and Siena, promoting projects to support the Jewish Community.
